What They Do

Automation Technicians are responsible for the installation, operation, and maintenance of computer and robotic systems used in a variety of agricultural sectors. They provide service and maintenance in a timely manner, this may include 24/7 emergency service. They must be proficient in multiple skill clusters including electricity & electronics, fluid power, mechanical systems, and manufacturing processes.

Job Duties

- Communicate status, manage expectations, resolve issues, and insure top-quality service
- Assist on installation and potentially work during automation equipment start up
- Work with team members, site customers, and leadership on assigned projects
- Provide expertise to continue advancement of automated systems throughout a site
- Install, maintain and inspect control system and workstation installations throughout a facility
- Schedule maintenance on automation technology to ensure its peak performance
- Ensure machines are properly calibrated
- Be part of a rotating schedule to provide 24/7 emergency service
- Look up and order maintenance and service parts for customers
- Provide system operation training on the assigned automation systems
- Attend employer continual training on Virtual Management System products
